**NAME AND PURPOSE**

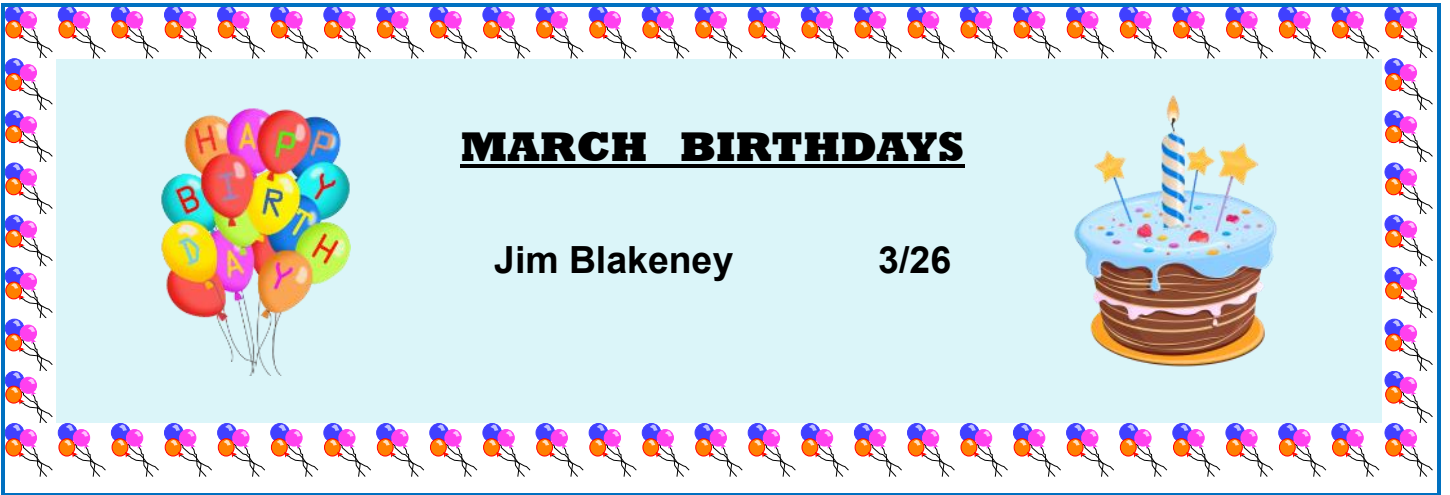
Sue is still suffering with a sore back from the move. She did go to the doctor and had an injection after she picked up a case of water—Oooo...pain!

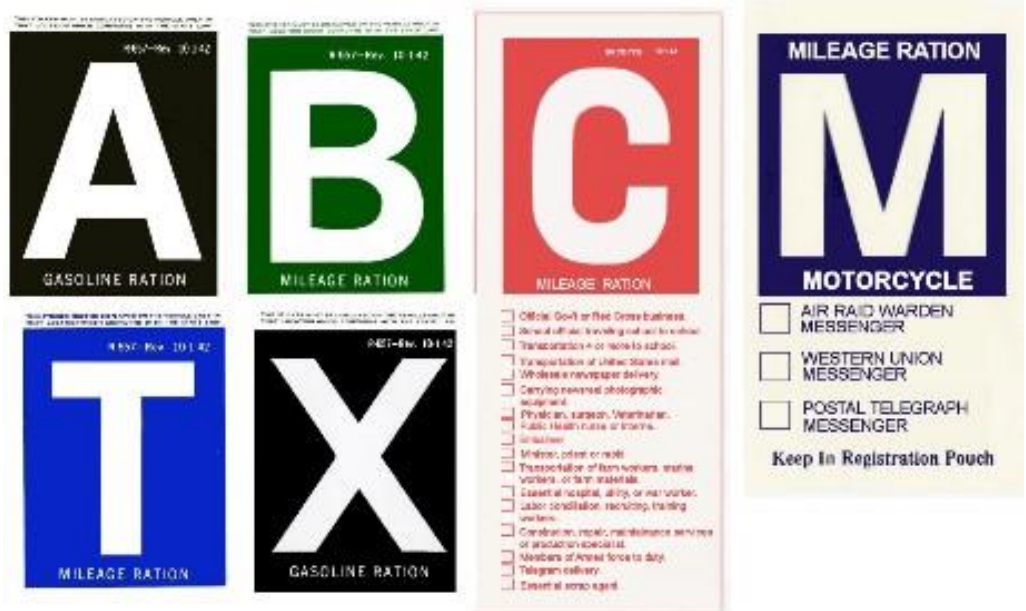
## Gas Ration Stickers

If you've been in the "old car" hobby for a while, chances are that you've seen gas ration stickers in the right corner of the windshields of classic cars. When World War II broke out, the U.S. Office of Price Administration (OPA) rationed gasoline on May 15, 1942 on the east coast, and nationwide that December to assist in the war effort. This was in reaction to shortages of gasoline, and stickers were introduced to control the amount of gasoline that the public consumed.

By law, the stickers had to be affixed to the lower right side of the windshield. Most car hobbyists have seen the "A" gas ration sticker, but there were several more types issued.

The "A" sticker was the most common and was issued to the general public. To get the sticker, you had to certify that you needed gasoline and that you owned no more than 5 tires, which were also rationed during the war.

The "B" sticker was issued to business owners. It allowed them to get more fuel for their business vehicles.



The "C" sticker was issued primarily to professional people, physicians, nurses, dentists, ministers, priests, mail delivery, embalmers, farm workers, construction or maintenance workers, soldiers and armed forces going to duty, and several others. The interesting thing about the "C" sticker is that there was a list of 17 different occupations and check boxes at the bottom of the form that the person had to check off to qualify for the sticker. In reality, the "C" sticker was probably the most common during the war, as many people tried to qualify to get more gasoline. However, after the war, most "C" sticker users scraped it off their windshield, as they didn't want the world to know their profession.

The "M" sticker was issued to motorcycle owners. This included telegraph delivery and other messenger services who used motorcycles for their business.

The "T" sticker was issued to truck drivers.

The "X" sticker was issued in special instances for high mileage type jobs such as traveling salesmen.

Reproductions of many of these stickers are available, and they add to the vehicle's restoration.

# Technical Tips

## Jim's Tech Tip by Jim Cannon

*When installing a radiator, Ford's Service Bulletins reminds you:*

### **DONOT DRAW RADIATOR BOLT NUTS DOWN TIGHTLY**

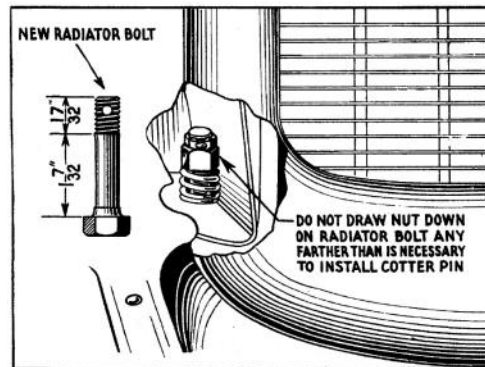

When mounting a radiator do not draw the radiator bolt nuts down any farther than is necessary to lock the nut with the cotter key. If these nuts are drawn down tightly it compresses the radiator to frame bolt springs to such an extent that the flexible feature of the springs is defeated and damage to the radiator invariably results.

Recently the threaded end of the radiator bolt was reduced from 5/8" to 17/32" which makes it impossible to screw the nut down farther than the correct distance. See Fig. 764. However, as practically all cars are equipped with the former design bolts, constant care must be exercised when screwing down the radiator bolt nuts.

#### **Good advice. My Tech Tip is this:**

Before installing the radiator bolt, paint a thin white line across the end of the bolt to show the orientation of the drilled hole for the cotter pin. Later, when you are tightening the nut, it gives you a way to orient the drilled hole in the bolt "front to back" so that it is easy to slip the cotter key in and bend it over. Once the nut is on the bolt, it is hard to see the little hole and it can be very frustrating to put the cotter pin in.

I hope that helps get your radiator installed a bit faster and easier.

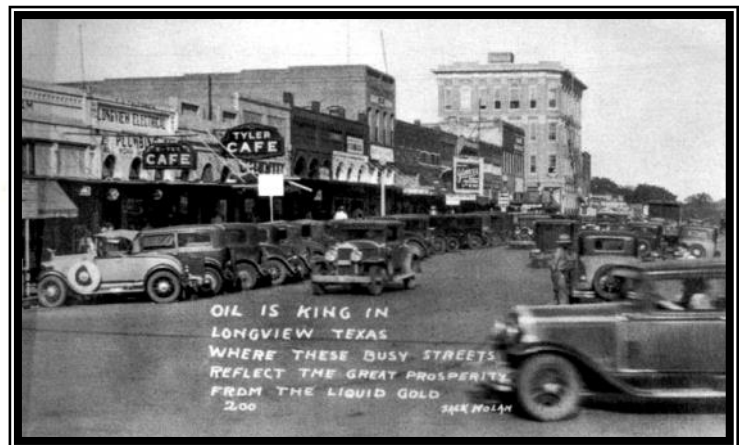

### Removing Rust from Chromed Surfaces



Often Model A Fords will develop rust on chrome surfaces. Here's an easy and low-cost method for removing rust from chrome.

1. Clean the chrome surface with soapy water to remove the dirt and debris.
2. Use cola, lime juice, vinegar, or other solutions that contain phosphoric acid in the ingredients.
3. Dip a small ball of aluminum foil in the liquid and rub it back and forth over the rusted areas. As you rub the chrome, keep the aluminum wet with the solution.
4. When satisfactorily cleaned, rinse and dry the surface of the chrome.
5. Apply chrome polish then wax to prevent more rust from forming.
