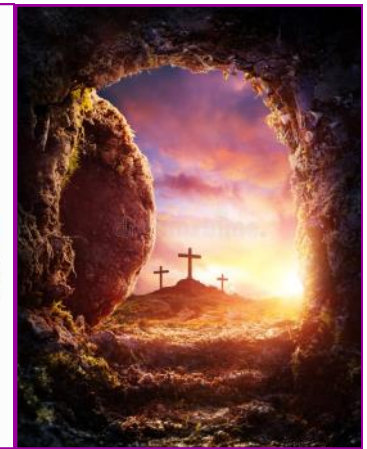

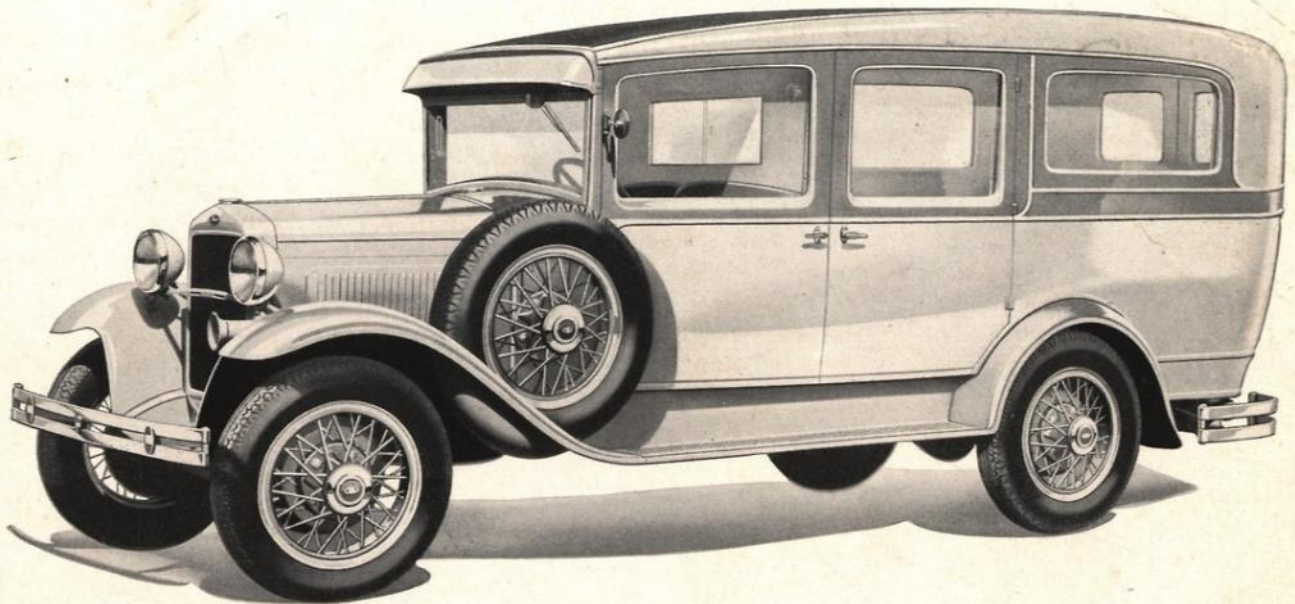

## Model AA Ford Chassis

**ENGINE**—Four-cylinder "L" head, cast en bloc. Piston displacement, 200.5 cubic inches; bore, 3 $\frac{7}{8}$  inches; stroke, 4 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches; horsepower rating, S. A. E., 24.03; brake horsepower, 40 at 2200 R. P. M.

**TRANSMISSION**—Selective sliding gear type, four speeds forward and one reverse. Gears and shafts of chrome-alloy steel, heat-treated for hardness.

**CLUTCH**—Single dry plate. Moulded asbestos composition facing. Completely enclosed and protected. Smooth and easy in action.

**BRAKES**—Service brakes on all four wheels. Emergency brakes operate independently on rear wheels. All are internal expanding and fully enclosed. Total braking surface is 474 $\frac{7}{8}$  sq. in.

**SPRINGS AND TORQUE TUBE**—Rear springs of the Ford trucks are full cantilever. Torque-tube drive relieves the springs of any but their natural function of absorbing shocks.

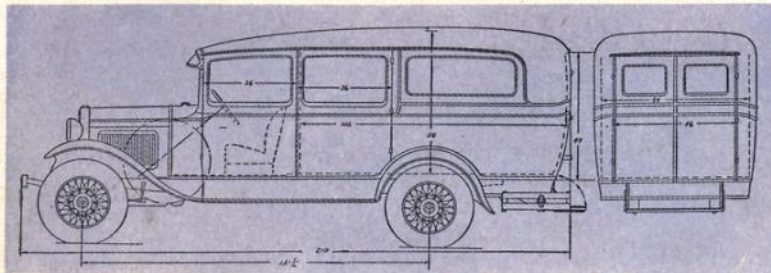


## THE FORD AMBULANCE

Mounted on the Ford 131 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wheelbase chassis, the Ambulance provides a high degree of safety and reliability. Its appointments are carefully designed to offer convenience and to facilitate every service that may be required of such a unit. A special, flexible rear spring and Houdaille shock absorbers at rear insure easy riding qualities. There is a door in either side, immediately behind the driver's compartment. The wide double doors at the rear operate a folding step. The windshield,

and all windows in the rear compartment, are of Triplex shatterproof glass. All doors in rear compartment are equipped with curtains of rubberized material. A single seat in the rear compartment will accommodate two attendants. Equipment includes a stretcher and truck, using a spring bed and mattress, and devices for locking this truck into place. The driver's compartment is fully enclosed, and has genuine black leather upholstery. A partition separates the two compartments, and is equipped with a sliding glass panel with a permanent wire screen. The interior is finished completely in white lacquer, with chromium plated trimmings. Equipment includes a buzzer to signal the driver, a composition floor mat, a dome light, a medicine-chest, a heater, and a fan in the partition. Provision is made for first-aid equipment.

## SYMBOLS

### THE SURPRISING ORIGINS OF EASTER SYMBOLS: FROM LAMBS TO LILIES

From lambs to lilies, there are many beautiful Easter symbols that have significance to us. But do you know why? The origin of the Easter egg is based on ancient fertility lore. The Easter bunny tradition came from the Germans (similar to Santa Claus). And then there are the Easter foods! Understand the symbolism and how Easter traditions began! Here's some table talk for your Easter dinner.

Easter is the most important feast day in the Christian church, celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The feast day is “movable” and always falls on the first Sunday after the first full Moon after the spring equinox.

#### EASTER EGGS

The oval-shape egg has been a universal symbol in many religions across the millennia, symbolizing new life, rebirth, and fertility.

According to *The Easter Book* by Francis X. Weiser, S.J., “[t]he origin of the Easter egg is based on the fertility lore of the Indo-European races. To our pre-Christian ancestors, it was a most startling event to see a new and live creature emerge from a seemingly dead object. The egg to them became a symbol of spring. Long ago in Persia, people used to present each other with eggs at the spring equinox, which for them also marked the beginning of a new year.”

In Judaism, eggs are an important part of the Passover seder plate. For some Christians, the egg symbolizes the rock tomb out of which Christ

emerged to the new life of his Resurrection. Also, there was a practical reason that eggs became popular on Easter: They were forbidden during the 40 days of Lent. However, chickens still laid eggs, so they were often collected and decorated.

In most countries, the eggs are stained in plain vegetable dye colors. Among Orthodox Christians, the faithful present each other with crimson eggs in honor of the blood of Christ. In parts of Eastern Europe, it's tradition to create intricate designs on the egg with wax or twine before coloring. In Germany and other countries, the eggs are pierced and made hollow so that they can be suspended from shrubs and trees during Easter Week—much like decorations on a Christmas tree.

Of course, many countries have egg hunts and games, too. Plastic eggs are often filled with candy treats, since it's the end of Lent.

#### THE EASTER BUNNY

The “Easter Bunny,” who visits children on Easter morning, was an invention of German Protestants; the *Osterhase* or “Easter Hare,” brought eggs and sweets to “good children,” in the same way that Santa Claus brought gifts to well-behaved youngsters.

The Easter Hare played this Santa Claus-like role at the start of the Easter season, judging whether or not children had been obedient to their parents. The symbolism is not particularly religious, but we can be reasonably certain that the Lutherans of long ago were not intending to teach their children about fertility. Like Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny is something fun to do with the kids.

**EASTER LAMB**

Among the popular Easter symbols, the lamb is by far the most significant of this great feast. The lamb is said to symbolize Jesus, as it embodies purity and goodness, but also represents sacrifice.

The lamb was a sacrifice made during the Jewish Passover, which is a holiday commemorating the passage of the “angel of death” over the homes of those who had smeared the blood of sacrificial lambs on their doorposts, thus sparing the firstborn sons. Roasted lamb shanks are an important part of the Passover seder plate; roasted leg of lamb is popular for Easter in Mediterranean countries such as Italy and Greece.

Jesus was crucified during Passover week and then made the ultimate sacrifice, his life. He is referred to as the “Lamb of God” and “our Passover lamb” in the Bible. During Easter, we celebrate Jesus’ passover from death to life.

**EASTER BREADS**

Sweet breads are also a tradition, especially with the conclusion of Lent, a period when many people do not indulge in sweets. For Christians, the resurrected Christ is called “the bread of life” (John 6:35), in whom believers will find their daily spiritual sustenance.

In Russia and Austria, the sweet breads are often marked with a cross or image of a lamb. In Germany, the Easter bread is baked in loaves of twisted or braided strands. Another kind of Austrian Easter bread is the *Osterlaib*, a large, flat, round loaf marked with the cross or an image of the lamb. In Poland and other countries, folks enjoy a special cake called the Easter *baba*.

In Greece, the traditional Easter bread is baked with a red-dyed egg on top, covered with two strips of dough in the form of a cross. In Italy, the Easter bread is braided with eggs, symbolizing new life.

**HOT CROSS BUNS**

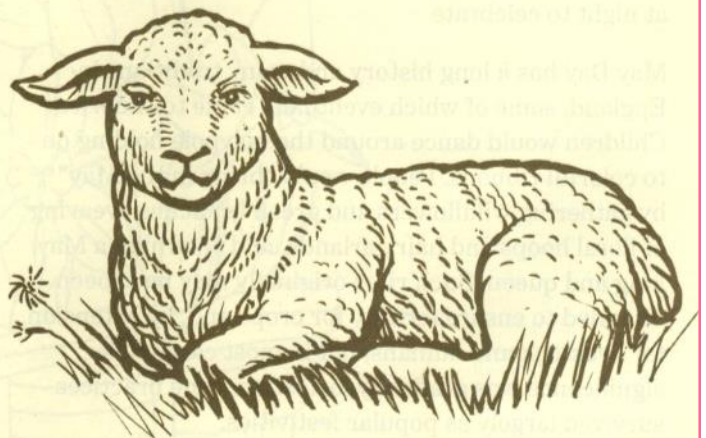
Hot cross buns, hot cross buns! Traditionally, this delicious sweet bun was served on Good Friday, the Friday prior to Easter. Good Friday marks the end of Lent and is the day that Jesus died on the cross. The sweet bun is marked with a cross to help the bread rise and as a visible sign that the bread was “blessed.”

**EASTER LILY**

The magnificent Easter lily, with its sheer white petals, symbolizes life, purity, innocence, joy, and peace. The beautiful white flowers of the lily were connected with these traits well before Jesus Christ. Many ancient allegories connect the flower with motherhood.

In early paintings, the Angel Gabriel is seen handing a bouquet of white lilies to the Virgin Mary. In other paintings, the saints are bringing vessels full of lilies to Mary and the baby Jesus. It is said that beautiful white lilies sprang up in the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus wept in the last hours before he was betrayed by Judas. The lilies sprang up where drops of Christ’s sweat fell to the ground in his final hours of sorrow.

The lilies from Christ’s time were not the Easter lily that we know today (*Lilium longiflorum*), which is native to the southern islands of Japan and now cultivated in areas such as California and Oregon. The lilies in Jesus’ area were wild lilies of the valleys and fields. Still, our Easter lily serves as a reminder of the lilies mentioned frequently throughout the Bible. Easter lilies grace homes and churches each spring as a symbol of new life.

**NAME AND PURPOSE**

# Technical Tips

## Jim's Tech Tips "Radiator Hoses"

If there is one thing we take for granted on the Model A engine, even more than the fan belt, it's the radiator hoses. We put them on and expect them to last "forever". But they don't. I've been on more than a few tours where someone ends up with a leaking radiator hose that interrupts their drive.

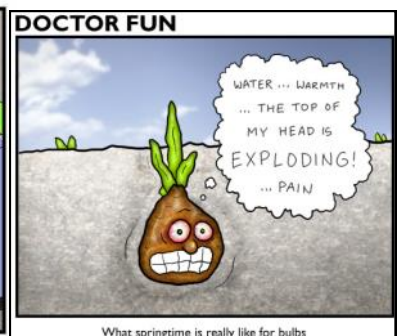
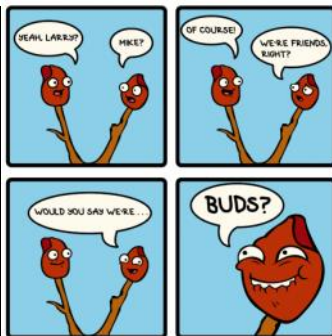
So today's Tech Tip is to remind you to inspect the radiator hoses and snug up the hose clamps (if needed) every time you change the engine oil. Look for signs of coolant seeping out of the hose, usually at the end. Look for obvious cracks and other signs the rubber is breaking down.



The upper radiator hose is subjected to the hottest coolant while you drive, so that is often the hose that starts leaking first. And the lower steel pipe tends to corrode away from the inside out, where you can't see it until it's too late. So look for coolant weeping down there, too.

A stock Model A does not run a pressurized cooling system, so it does not have a lot of pressure on the hoses. However, if you have a thermostat installed in your upper hose, the hose section between the engine outlet neck and the thermostat sees a lot of pressure when the thermostat is not open. A leak there can pump all of your coolant out in no time at all. So check that area carefully.

It's probably overkill, but to avoid a problem on the road, I replace my radiator hoses and coolant about every 3 years of normal driving. Avoid problems, and *Have a Model A Day!*

# Hubley Derby Rules

These are the rules for the MAFCA National Convention in Kerrville, TX June 12-17, 2022.

## The Track:

- Three lanes wide
- Forty feet long.
- Manual car "launching"
- Electronic timing
- Pillow or soft object at end of the track

## The Cars:

- The cars must be metal 1:20 scale models made by Hubley, Gabriel, and Scale Model. Any of the seven Model "A" body styles may be used: Sedan, Station Wagon, Coupe, Roadster, Roadster Pickup, Victoria, and Phaeton.
- Cars must be stock including the original tires, wheels, and axle screws. **No modifications allowed.** No substitute axle screws.
- Steering may be secured or loose at makers choice.
- Cars will be weighed and inspected during registration. Weight of each car can be no more than 1 pound, 5 ounces (station wagon weight). A small amount of leeway will be allowed due to the differences of scales. Weights added to lighter cars must be secured, not loose in car.
- A dry lubricant (graphite for example) is allowed at owners choice.

## The Classes:

**Class 1:** 3-12 year olds  
**Class 2:** 13-17 year olds  
**Class 3:** 18 and over

## Entering The Race:

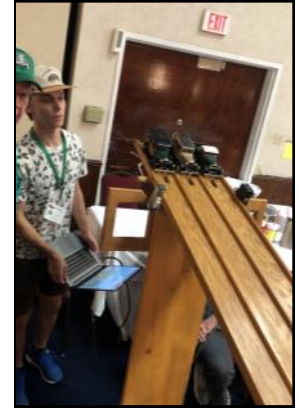
- The Racing Entry Form must be filled out.
- Once a car completes the check-in process it CANNOT be handled or worked on by the owner
- Cars will be assigned a number (a removable sticker attached to car)

## The Race:

- After the cars are checked in, all handling and racing of the cars is done by race personnel. At the time their cars are being raced, the competitors may be called up to the track.
- Cars from each class will be pitted against each other in random order to determine Champion, 2nd, and 3rd place. In the final event, each class Champions will race to determine the overall winner. Prizes are awarded for the first three places in each age group and for the overall champion.
- Each car will be raced three times *once in each lane*.
- The time for each race will be recorded by computer. The lowest combined time is the winner for each class.

## People's Choice Award:

The People's Choice Award is presented to the owner of the "people's" favorite Hubley Car. Balloting will begin once all cars are entered into the race and numbered and the winner will be the entry that receives the most votes. Ballots will be available in the race area and are limited to one vote per person. While voting is open to all ages, keep in mind the spirit of this competition—keep it fun and fair.
